

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Classification: Home Manager/Case Aide

I. JOB DUTIES

A. Transportation of children in care for:

1. Visits with parents
2. Doctor appointments
3. School
4. Agency consulting psychologist visits
5. Mental health visits
6. Hospital visits or appointments
7. Placement to foster homes
8. Independent Living classes and field trips
9. Baby sitting (respite care)

B. Transportation of adult clients to:

1. Health department
2. Appointments
3. A.D.A.S. sessions
4. Mental Health visits
5. Grocery store visits
6. Shopping for children
7. General errands at times

C. Neighborhood Based Family Advocate

1. Assists caseworker by working with family to make community-based links and initiate relationships with neighborhood based formal and informal services
2. Provides support to family in skill acquisition regarding advocating for child and self
3. Assists family in developing functional relationship with foster family, support and reinforce foster parent modeling from birth family when requested to do so by caseworker
4. Provide supervised visitation – working with family while modeling effective parent/child interaction
5. Attend Family Team Meeting and Team Decision Making – Family Case Conference process upon request

C. Home Manager

1. Discuss cleaning and budgeting methods with clients
2. Assess and set up cleaning routine for clients
3. Assess and set up budget with clients
4. Monitor and document client progress by narration and/or selected forms
5. Secure cleaning aids for clients, if needed

II. JOB REQUIREMENTS

- A. Must possess a valid Ohio driver's license
- B. Must possess auto insurance required by law and agency needs
- C. A safe driving record
- D. Must have experience working with children, including infants and adolescents
- E. A willingness and ability to work with diverse populations
- F. Must have access to private auto on a daily basis
- G. Must have, at minimum, a high school diploma, college preferred

- H. Ability to plan, organize and prioritize job duties
