PCSAO serves as the administrator of Ohio START (Sobriety, Treatment and Reducing Trauma), an evidence-informed children services-led intervention model that helps public children services agencies (PCSAs) bring together caseworkers, behavioral health providers, and family peer mentors into teams dedicated to helping families struggling with co-occurring child maltreatment and substance use disorder. The overall goal of this program is to stabilize families harmed by parental addiction so that both children and their parents can recover and move forward with healthy and safe lives.

In this role, the program coordinator will assist Ohio START managers with implementation and provision of the Ohio START training and technical assistance programs, manage Ohio START's race, equity and inclusion work, assist the PCSAO Director Team with the best practice advancement activities and assist with coordination of the PCSAO's Race, Equity, and Inclusion Learning Agenda.

This person will also have experience working in the field of child welfare, addiction, or behavioral health, and providing and/or coordinating professional development trainings for child welfare, addiction, or a related field.
