

Ohio START (Sobriety, Treatment, and Reducing Trauma) Family Peer Mentor

A Family Peer Mentor (FPM) provides peer support to help families involved with Child welfare where substance abuse is the primary risk factor. The FPM will serve as a member of a Multi-disciplinary team to support and encourage families in their recovery.

Duties: Full-time (40 hours/week) located in Butler County. Position will be a combination of office and community-based work and will involve transporting clients as needed. Administrative duties include: entering records in the EHR, provide assistance with outcome data and reporting, communicate regularly with referral sources and providers. Clinical duties include: service documentation, participate in case-staffing, provide Motivational interviewing and support, engage in correspondence with BCCS and other service providers, provide SUD and MH case management, and perform other related duties as assigned. FPM will help manage a case load of 10 to 12 families.

Minimum Qualifications: High School Diploma or equivalent. CDCA preferred. Applicant must be able to communicate effectively in both oral and written form. Individual must be able to work both independently and with a team. Experience with electronic health records preferred. Must demonstrate long term recovery from SUD. Have lived experience with the child welfare system either as a parent or a child. Must have a motor vehicle in good working order and maintain a current driver's license and Automobile insurance.
